 - o Internet (high speed connection)
 - o Word Processors, Win Way Resume and other software
- > Print/Multimedia:
 - o Reference Books
 - o Circulating Books, Videos, DVD's, CD's, etc.....
 - o Magazines and Newspapers
- > Human:
 - o Reference Librarians
 - Via phone, email, fax or "virtual" reference

 - Our Electronic Titles

3 Important Electronic Resources for Jobseekers

- > American Business
 - o helps in finding leads for potential employers and to do quick background research before an interview
- > NetLibrary
 - o provides quick access to eBooks via the library's online catalog
- > Factiva/Ebsco Host
 - o good for finding out the latest news on a company or for doing other research to brush up before an interview or applying to a position.
